2023 Retiree Champion Award

We are pleased to honor Chicago Mayor Brandon Johnson with the 2023 Retiree Champion Award.

This award was created to honor elected leaders who are dedicated champions of needs and rights of seniors and retirees across the state.

Brandon Johnson was sworn in as the 57th Mayor of the City of Chicago on May 15, 2023.

Mayor Johnson began his career as a public school teacher, first at Jenner Academy in Cabrini-Green and then at Westinghouse College Prep on the West Side, where he experienced firsthand how school closures, unemployment and gun violence impacted his students and their communities. He then went on to become an organizer with the Chicago Teachers Union, where he led multi-racial coalitions to defend neighborhood schools from privatization, reduce high-stakes standardized testing and expand access to state funding.

Mayor Johnson was elected Cook County Commissioner of the 1st District in 2018. During his five years on the Cook County Board, he led efforts to pass the Just Housing Ordinance which prohibited housing discrimination against formerly incarcerated people, legislation to secure legal representation for immigrants facing deportation, and coordinated COVID-19 resources for low-income seniors in nursing homes.

In 2018, Mayor Johnson was elected Commissioner of the 1st District of Cook County.here he led the effort to pass the Just Housing Ordinance, which prohibited housing discrimination against formerly incarcerated people. As commissioner, he also collaborated with colleagues to eliminate the gang database, secure legal representation for immigrants facing deportation and advance recognition of Indigenous Peoples' Day. In the wake of civil uprisings in the summer of 2020, he organized the Cook County Board to commit to the "Budget for Black Lives," bringing new investments in health care, public transportation, internet access, and affordable housing.

Mayor Johnson and his wife Stacie live in the Austin community, where they are raising their children Owen, Ethan and Braedyn.

MAYOR BRANDON JOHNSON APPOINTS BRIDGET EARLY TO SERVE AS DEPUTY MAYOR FOR LABOR RELATIONS

CHICAGO — Today, Mayor Brandon Johnson announced that Bridget Early will serve as the City of Chicago's first-ever Deputy Mayor for Labor Relations.

"I'm thrilled to welcome Bridget as Chicago's new Deputy Mayor for Labor Relations and continue to build upon our city's rich history of uplifting working families and fighting for economic justice for all workers," **said Mayor Brandon Johnson**. "I look forward to her partnership in creating pathways to jobs, improving working conditions, and supporting the working people who make our city run."

Early brings to the role more than 15 years of experience in legislative engagement and project management. She most recently served as Director of Membership and Strategic Alliances for the National Conference on Public Employee Retirement Systems. She has previously served as Executive Director of the National Public Pension Coalition and Director of Legislative and Political Affairs for the Chicago Federation of Labor.

"Growing up in a union household, I understand how good-paying jobs can uplift families and communities," **said Bridget Early**. "I look forward to working with Mayor Johnson and building upon our shared values of labor rights and dignity for all the working people of Chicago – the City that Works."

As Deputy Mayor for Labor Relations, Early will responsible for working with all City agencies and departments to foster, promote, and develop the welfare of the wage earners, job seekers, and retirees of Chicago; improve working conditions; advance opportunities for profitable employment; and assure work-related benefits and rights, including working with relevant authorities to help enforce workers' statutory rights.

2023 Frank and Beatrice Lumpkin Award

We are pleased to present the Frank and Beatrice Lumpkin Award to Illinois Federation of Teachers President, Dan Montgomery

This award was created to recognize dedicated dedicated movement leaders who not only help to power our organization, but who have dedicated their lives building the labor movement, and continue to push on for a better life for everyone.

Daniel J. Montgomery has worked on behalf of public education and the rights of working men and women for more than two decades. He was elected to a three-year term as president of the 103,000-member Illinois Federation of Teachers at the union's convention in October 2010 and unanimously reelected in 2013, 2016, 2019, and 2022.

He received his B.A. in English, summa cum laude, from the University of Michigan and holds an M.S.Ed. from Northwestern University. A dedicated and experienced educator, Montgomery taught English for 18 years at Niles North High School in Skokie, Ill. He has also taught in the City Colleges of Chicago and at Northwestern University.

Montgomery is a proud union activist. He has been an IFT member since his first day of teaching in 1993. He served as head of the 1,800-member North Suburban Teachers Union, AFT Local 1274, for nearly 10 years and was a vice president on the IFT Executive Board from 2002 until his election to the IFT presidency. Montgomery also serves as a

president of the American Federation of Teachers (AFT), where he sits on the Executive Committee with AFT President Randi Weingarten.

Montgomery is also a vice president of the Illinois AFL-CIO and serves on the Boards of Directors of the Albert Shanker Institute, the Center for Tax and Budget Accountability, and Chicago's Theater Oobleck. In 2011, Governor Pat Quinn appointed him a trustee of the Lincoln Academy of Illinois. He served seven years as a director of the prestigious National

Board for Professional Teaching Standards.

Dan has three children and lives in Chicago, Illinois.

He is committed to the IARA mission of retirement with dignity and economic security for every worker and to bringing the next generation of seniors into our movement.


